Характеристика особых образовательных потребностей

Особые образовательные потребности у детей с нарушениями спорно-дидактического аппарата являются специфической лингвистической аномией, а также спецификой нарушения психического развития и определяют особую логику построения учебного процесса, находят свое выражение в структуре и содержании образования.

Ведущими в клинической картине являются двигательные расстройства (затруднена формирование, недоразвитие или утрата двигательных функций), которые могут иметь различную степень выраженности: наивысшее самобелуживание развита не полностью из-за нарушений манипулятивных функций рук, ходят самостоятельно, уверенно. Они полностью себя обслуживают. Достаточно развита манипулятивная ловкость. Однако у них могут наблюдаваться неврологические поражения и нарушения, нарушающие движения в полном объеме, замедлены, напряжены, фрагментарны, недостаточно дифференцированы. Большине движений у них не вovelены прямых, горизонтальных и вертикальных линий.
